<b>Course Title</b>	Provide First Aid (Formerly Level Two First Aid)
<b>Course Description</b>	This unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to a casualty. The unit applies to all workers who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of situations, include community and workplace settings.
<b>Prerequisite</b>	Not Applicable
<b>Course duration</b>	Option one – Standard course - Two day training session Option two – Combination course – One day - This flexible option combines personal study / theory assessment with a 1 day face to face training session.
<b>Qualification</b>	A Nationally Recognised Statement of Attainment
<b>Course structure</b>	These skills and knowledge may be applied in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.
<b>Required skills</b>	<p>First aid management of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>abdominal injuries</li> <li>allergic reactions</li> <li>altered and loss of consciousness</li> <li>apply an AED</li> <li>bleeding</li> <li>burns - thermal, chemical, friction, electrical</li> <li>cardiac arrest / CPR / chest pain / chain of survival</li> <li>choking/airway obstruction</li> <li>duty of care and other legal requirements</li> <li>injuries: cold and crush injuries; eye and ear injuries; head, neck and spinal injuries; minor skin injuries; needle stick injuries; soft tissue injuries including sprains, strains, dislocations</li> <li>envenomation - snake, spider, insect and marine bites</li> <li>environmental impact such as hypothermia, hyperthermia, dehydration, heat stroke</li> <li>fractures</li> <li>medical conditions, including cardiac conditions, epilepsy, diabetes, asthma and other respiratory conditions</li> <li>near drowning</li> <li>poisoning and toxic substances (including chemical contamination)</li> <li>respiratory distress</li> <li>seizures / shock / stroke</li> <li>substance misuse - common drugs and alcohol, including illicit drugs</li> <li>cultural issues</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment</b>	<p>To be deemed competent in this unit, participants are required to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Perform at least two minutes of uninterrupted CPR on both an infant <b>and</b> an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor</li> </ul>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Participate in problem solving scenarios and demonstrate the required knowledge and skills</li><li>• Complete a theory assessment paper</li></ul>
